Italian Chamber of Commerce signs new MOU's for Trade with Italy

The Italian Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Australia – Adelaide has recently signed new MOU's with several Italian Chambers of Commerce in Italy following a successful business visit to Italy by Teodoro Spiniello, Secretary-General and Antonio Rosata, Project Officer.

ICCI – Adelaide will host two commercial desks representing the Chambers of Commerce of Brindisi and Reggio Calabria and their member companies. Reciprocal desks will be operated by these chambers in Italy for South Australian member companies looking at potential outbound and inbound commercial/institutional missions to Australia/Italy within the next year.

Negotiations are underway to finalise a similar agreement with the Chamber of Commerce of Napoli. Discussions have also commenced with the Chambers of Commerce of Macerata, and of Potenza for future collaboration.

The mission will focus on two of Australia's strongest sectors relevant to the GCC countries - agribusiness and education. Companies from other sectors are also welcome to participate and will be provided with separate, specifically tailored, visit programs where ever possible.

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) is already a major market for Australian exporters of goods and services. The downturn following The GFC reduced two-way trade by approximately 7% but this has now recovered to its pre GFC level. As was outlined at the recent inaugural Australian Arab Business Forum & Expo the UAE economy is once again growing strongly – with a continued focus on tourism and hospitality. The Australia Arab Chamber of Commerce & Industry (AACCI) believes that there is significant potential for Australian companies to expand their business or to develop new markets in this wealthy economy This view is supported by Austrade.

In addition there are newer markets with considerable potential in both Qatar and Oman.

Ms Frances Adamson has been appointed as Australia's next Ambassador to China by Hon Kevin Rudd, Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade. Ms Adamson is an Economics graduate from the University of Adelaide of 1985. The Mandarin speaking career diplomat has previously served in Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Britain, the last as Deputy High Commissioner.

She will take up the post in August replacing Dr Geoff Raby, who has been Ambassador since 2007.
