CITCSA commenced with some 16 member organizations. The council is currently comprised of 37 international chambers of commerce and business councils – the membership of which is some 3,000 plus individuals and companies, mostly from South Australia's small and medium sized business sector.

CITCSA works in close cooperation with key partners the State Government, and with Austrade, Department of Foreign Affairs & Trade and other export related organisations, both public and private.
